**AM Session:** 9:00a.m.-12:00p.m.

**PM Session:** 12:40-3:40p.m.

**Drop Off:** Students registered for both sessions or morning only may be dropped off at the West Shore Community College Tech Center beginning at 8:30a.m., where supervision will be available. Students registered for the afternoon session only should be dropped off in the Schoenherr Campus Center main lobby beginning at 12:15p.m.

**Pick Up:** Students registered for both sessions the afternoon only may be picked up at the West Shore Community College Tech Center no later than 4:00p.m. Students registered for the morning session only may be picked up in the Schoenherr Campus Center main lobby by no later than 12:30p.m. Students must be signed out by a parent or guardian at the end of their day.

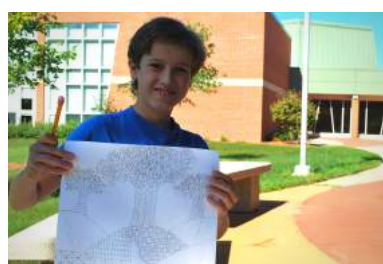

# THE ARTS

## **Creating with Polymer Clay with Jennifer VonDrak • PM Session**

In Creating with Polymer Clay, students will learn how versatile and easy the bakeable clay is to work with. Clay will be mixed to create new colors and different patterns in order to create beads for a necklace. From there, students will use their hands to mold clay into recognizable animals and food that, once baked and made into a charm (with a hook and clasp), can be hung on a necklace, bracelet or backpack.

## **Paints, Palettes, and Pastels with Michele Anscombe • Ages 9-12 years old • AM Session**

Spend the entire week painting! This class will include Acrylic, Watercolor, and Pastel painting. Explore different styles and types of painting to create a variety of work each day. This is a fun approach to try a little bit of everything while learning about color and how to use it in artwork.

## **Paper & Pottery with Rachel Brock • PM Session**

Work with multiple materials and make homemade paper used to create paper masks. Pottery masks will also be created, fired, and painted. Play with how to add different materials to paper to create textures and colors. Learn the terms, techniques, and procedures in working with clay.

## **Passport Kids with Cathie Critchett • AM Session**

Travel through the culture, style, and art history of Germany, France, Switzerland, Austria, Jamaica, and Canada's Eastern Provinces. Students will use their passport to track where they have visited and what their favorite artist was from each country.

## **PopArt Painting with Michele Anscombe • Ages 11-15 years old • PM Session**

Create artwork that is influenced by our popular culture! Comics, advertisements, and mass media will be our inspiration along with famous artists; Andy Warhol, Takashi Murakami, Elizabeth Murray and Claes Oldenberg. We will learn about color, mixing paint, applying paint and using both acrylic and watercolor paint to complete our artwork throughout the week. Painting a PopArt selfie and creating a comic are just the beginning to this exciting exploration of paint and pop art.

## **Sketch Your World with Cathie Critchett • PM Session**

In this mixed media class, students will learn basic drawing techniques on how to sketch nature. Uncover breaking down nature into shapes to get a complete picture. Once the drawing is complete, students will learn how to use acrylic and watercolor paint to bring their sketches to life!

## **Watercolor Adventures with Amanda Mobley • AM Session**

Uncover fundamentals & beginner techniques of Watercolor! Students will dive into the properties, techniques, & tricks of the trade with an expert, to create realistic looking paintings using watercolors!

## **Weaving Workshop with Rachel Brock • AM Session**

Using bright colors and beautiful textured material students will learn to weave! Each student will bring home a weaved wall tapestry and another small woven item.



# OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

## **Archery with Mark Willis • PM Session**

Learn the sport of archery by making your own arrows and shooting your bow with precision and accuracy. Class will cover safety, history of archery, bow hunting, and practice at different targets. Limited bows available for use. Please contact Cara at 231.843.5825 if you need to reserve a bow. Otherwise, please bring a personal bow to class.

## **Farm to Fork with Jorhie Beadle • AM and PM Sessions**

This hands on session will teach students about how food is produced – from the farm to the fork. Students will be able to plant seeds, build compost and even play with livestock. We will be exploring some strange veggies and cool water animals. Students should be prepared to get their hands dirty and be outside.

## **Pond Ecology and Fly Fishing with Mark Willis • AM Session**

Investigate the living and non-living components of the West Shore pond. Students will get hands on experience netting and collecting macro invertebrates, testing water quality, and fishing with hook and line. During the week students will construct a miniature pond using a large jar or two liter bottle that will be taken home at the end of the course. Students should bring a two liter bottle and fishing poles (if possible). Bug spray and rubber boots are recommended.

# S.T.E.M.

## **Digital Photography with Julia LeGalley • AM and PM Sessions**

Learn and apply basic photography skills including the rule of thirds and filling the frame. Journey through four different styles of photography! Beginning with Forced Perspective, side walk chalk and various props will be used to showcase how to use what is around you to create interesting photos. The second style, Macro Photography, teaches how to look closer for that perfect shot. The third and final styles will be portrait and abstract photography. As a final project, complete a photobook highlighting your best work. Class is for cell phones & tablets only!

## **Creative Carpentry with Erica Karmeisool • AM: 9-11 year olds • PM: 12-15 year olds**

Students will learn about careers in design, engineering and carpentry by making a mini bag-toss yard game. Our project will launch with a fun game of bag-toss while we invent ways to make it better. We'll plan, design and construct our very own game to take home. Students will learn the basics of carpentry and use tools, such as saws, drills, pneumatic nailers and sanders.

## **Electric Kids with Nick Swan • AM and PM Sessions**

Kids discover fun projects through learning how to solder and build electronics to take home.

## **Engineering by Design with Cody Leedham • AM and PM Sessions**

Design and model your own custom keychain prototype and cut it out with a 3D printer and CNC Milling Machine in the Mechatronics Lab.



# HUMANITIES

## **American Sign Language with Sarah Hresko • AM Session**

This course has been offered in the past but is back by popular demand! This American Sign Language course is for signers of all abilities, those interested in learning ASL or those who already know a few signs. This course will be able to meet the needs of various signing abilities because it will be taught by two instructors! The most exciting part of this course is that one teacher is hearing and the other teacher is deaf. Come learn ASL vocabulary, phrases, and communication skills from natural signers while having fun and meeting new people.

## **Culinary Arts with Jared Funk • AM and PM Sessions**

With the guided expertise of Chef Jared, students will learn how to prepare a week's worth of meals on their own. They will go over breakfast, lunch, and dinner options, as well as pasta and bread. Each day will be something new!

## **Imagination Workshop with Jennifer VonDrak • AM Session**

In Imagination Workshop, students will learn how to use their imagination to craft the perfect story. Each session will tackle an element of story: character, setting, plot, conflict and prose. Fun exercises will help students hone their skills and apply them to their own story. (EX: Imagine a world where oranges were purple --- would they still taste like oranges?) By the end of class, students will have put their new writing skills to the page in order to write the first chapter of their new book!

## **Music Exploration**

This music sampler is a class that is a taste of different unique musical instruments and singing. The class will include reading simple music, voice techniques, hand bells, ukulele, accordion and guitar (chords). The student must take on all the samples of instruments in this class. The class will have group and individual time for their instrument of the day. The last class will include a simple fun "recital" of their talents put together.

## **Philosophy Through Movies with Matt Sanderson • PM Session (12-15 year olds)**

What can you know for certain? Do you have free will? What defines you as a person? What is the meaning of life? This class will explore these and other big questions through an examination of movies such as The Truman Show, Evan Almighty, and Groundhog Day.

## **Philosophy Through Stories with Matt Sanderson • AM Session (9-11 year olds)**

This interactive course is designed to empower young minds to use their reasoning ability to begin thinking deeply about life's big philosophical questions. Through discussion, playing games, and reading children's literature by authors such as Dr. Seuss and Shel Silverstein, students' sense of wonder will awaken to life's greatest mysteries.

## **Project Runway with Amanda Mobley • PM Sessions**

The art and technique of using fabrics and fibers to create wearable art. Students will be given the opportunity to tie dye, bleach dye, batik resist dye, fabric paint, hand sew, work with materials like fabric, yarn, new sew glue, ribbon, and dyes to enhance new or slightly used garments from shirts, to skirts, to handbags and more. At the end of the week students will participate in a fashion show to "show off" their handmade fashion items. All experience levels welcome.

## **Turn Desserts into a Business Tom Hinman • AM and PM Session**

Design a dessert restaurant from the ground up. Discover what goes on behind the scenes in a restaurant, how to order inventory, pick the menu, cook the items, and create the setting. On Friday, create a real life restaurant for parents to visit and try your delicious treats! \*\*We will be using nuts and items will not be gluten free - please let us know of any allergies\*\*
