

Student Protocol for Confirmed COVID-19 Case

Students who have tested positive for COVID-19 must notify the Student Services Office.

WSSC may also receive notification directly from District Health Department #10.

POSITIVE TEST RESULT – Students are directed to stay at home in isolation and to seek medical attention if necessary. Students should not return to class for at least 10 days after symptoms first started **AND** 24 hours after fever has resolved without the use of fever reducing medications (i.e. Tylenol®, Motrin®, etc.) **AND** symptoms have improved whichever is longer.*

Students are advised to contact their instructor(s) and follow normal class absence procedures. The Student Services Office will not contact instructor(s) directly unless there are specific student concerns.

CAMPUS RESPONSE NOTIFICATIONS/RESPONSIBILITIES

- The Student Services Office is responsible for notifying Executive Leadership and cooperating with District Health Department #10 as needed to complete contact tracing.
- The Dean of Student Services, in consultation with Executive Leadership and District Health Department #10, is responsible for determining the impacted campus community based on case specific information and sending any required Clery notification. Individuals who are determined to have had a close contact level of exposure will be notified directly by District Health Department #10.
- The Student Services Office will communicate with the Director of Facilities to initiate cleaning and disinfecting protocols.
 - Impacted area(s) will be closed until cleaning and disinfecting is complete.
 - Area closed for 24 hours prior to cleaning and disinfecting.
 - CDC Cleaning & Disinfecting protocol will be followed.
- The Student Services Office will advise students to contact their instructor(s).

*In accordance with CDC and District Health Department #10 guidance.

All cases will be handled on an individual basis with a goal of consistency. District Health Department #10 will be consulted and provide guidance in any situations that do not fall within normal recommendations.
